TERM OF THE COMPETITION

1. MANAGEMENT

1.1 19th Perlis Amateur Open 2025. Men & Ladies (hereinafter referred to as the Championship) shall be managed by an Organizing Committee (hereinafter referred to as “The Tournament Committee”) whose decisions in all matters relating to the Championship shall be final.

2. VENUE AND DATE

2.1 The Championship will be played over the 54 holes at Kelab Golf Putra (KGP) on **3rd - 5th October 2025** or any other course deemed fit by The Tournament Committee.

3. SCHEDULE OF PLAY

3.1 The schedule of play shall be as follows:

4. FORMAT OF PLAY

4.1 The tournament shall be decided by stroke play over 3 rounds of 18 holes each day, subject to The Tournament Committee’s right in the event of circumstances which make the playing of 54 holes impracticable, to cancel any round or rounds at its discretion.

4.2 **There shall be cut-off after 36 holes of play. The top 50% and ties for each category except ladies’ categories leading players shall advance to the final round depending on the number of participants at the discretion of Organizing Committee.**

5. ELIGIBILITY

5.1 The Tournament Gross Category is open to male & female players who are:

- a) Amateur Golfers in accordance with the Rules of Amateur Status as approved by the R&A Rules Limited.
- b) Having a maximum WHS Handicap Index of **11.5 Men** (club Handicap 12 and below) and **16.0 Ladies** (club handicap 20 and below) which must be current at the time of entry.
- c) Member of a Club affiliated to Malaysian Golf Association (MGA) with similar handicap indices.

5.2 The Tournament Intermediate A category is open to male players who are:

- d) Amateur Golfers in accordance with the Rules of Amateur Status as approved by the R&A Rules Limited.
- e) Having a maximum WHS Handicap Index of **11.5 Men** (club Handicap 12 and below) which must be current at the time of entry.
- f) Member of a Club affiliated to Malaysian Golf Association (MGA) with similar handicap indices.

5.3 The Tournament Intermediate B category is open to male players who are:

- g) Amateur Golfers in accordance with the Rules of Amateur Status as approved by the R&A Rules Limited.
- h) Having a WHS Handicap Index of **12.6 to 16.4 Men** (club Handicap 13 - 18 only) which must be current at the time of entry.
- i) Member of a Club affiliated to Malaysian Golf Association (MGA) with similar handicap indices.

The Tournament Committee reserves the right to reject any entry without giving any reason. Players without a WHS Handicap Index issued by the MGA are not eligible to participate. Players from non-NHS Clubs may participate subject to The Tournament Committee's sole discretion but would be eligible to win prizes in the Gross category only.

- 6.1** Entries must be accompanied with the full Entry Fee **RM 320.00 nett** for (Members Club), **RM 400.00 nett** (Non-Member Clubs) or **USD 120.00** for (Foreign) payable by cheque to **KELAB GOLF PUTRA PERLIS** or cash deposit into Maybank **Bank Account Number 509017-000089** (Please attach the payment slip together with the entry form upon submission with your name and HP number written at the back of the slip). Those unable to register within the stipulated times may be accepted at the discretion of The Committee. **Entry forms without the accompanying payment will NOT be accepted.**

Entry fee shall include ***tournament green fees, buggy fees on twin sharing basis, daily golf insurance, lunch on the tournament's days and goodies.***

- 6.2 The field shall be limited to **112 competitors** on first come first serve basis. In the event that entries fall short or exceed the number, The Tournament Committee reserves the right to make amendments on the entry requirements without giving any reason whatsoever.

7. WITHDRAWAL

- 7.1** The entry fee will not be refunded if any competitors withdraw from the tournament and the withdrawal is made after 5.00 p.m. on **25th September 2025. (THURSDAY)**

8. REGISTRATION

- 8.1** All competitors are required to register in person or by telephone by **5.00 p.m. on 29th September 2025**. Failure to do so may result in the competitor being withdrawn from the Championship with no refund of any fees paid.

9. RULES OF PLAY

- 9.1** Rules of play shall be in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the R&A Rules Limited and the local Rules of the Championship as approved by The Tournament Committee.

10. PRACTICE ROUND

- 10.1** Official practice round is on **2nd October 2025 (Thursday)** from 7.30 am onwards. All players **must leave the golf course by 4.00 pm**. Buggy fee is **RM 150.00 nett** per player on twin sharing basis and **RM 95.00 nett** per on single riders basis. Tee time for practice round player must directly booking with the Club.

11. DRAWS & STARTING TIMES

- 11.1** Player shall be in groups of four/three (4/3) competitors at 10/9 minutes interval.
- 11.2** The Tournament Committee will decide the draw and the starting time for the first two rounds. The draw for the final round will be arranged according to the first 2 rounds scores; the lowest scores will tee off last from the first tee and the highest scores will tee off last from the tenth tee.
- 11.3** The draws and starting times shall be posted at the Tournament Notice Board. Such posting shall be considered sufficient enough notice for information and distribution.
- 11.4** The player shall start at the time laid down by the Tournament Committee. If a player arrives at his starting point ready to play within five minutes after his starting time, the penalty for failure to start on time shall be two strokes at the starting hole (Rule 5.3a). Otherwise, the penalty for breach of these rules shall be **DISQUALIFICATION**.

“Exception: Where the Committee determines that exceptional circumstances have prevented a player from starting on time, there is no penalty.”

- 11.5 The Tournament Committee reserves the right to change the draws and vary the starting times without giving any reason thereof.

12. PACE OF PLAY (Rule 5.6)

Time Allowed

- 12.1 Each hole has been given a maximum completion time based upon the length and difficulty of the hole. The maximum time allotted for the completion of 18 holes will be available prior to play.

Definition of Out Of Position

- 12.2 The first group and any group after a starter's gap will be considered to be "out of position" if at any time during the round, the group's cumulative time exceeds the time allowed for the number of holes played. Any following group will be considered "out of position" if it is more than the starting time interval behind the group in front and has exceeded the time allowed for the number of the holes played.

Procedure When Group Is Out Of Position

- 12.3. If the decision is taken to time the group, each player in the group will be subject to individual timing by a Referee. Each player in the group will be advised that they are "out of position" and are being timed.
- 12.4 The maximum time allocated per shot is 40 seconds. 10 extra seconds are allowed for the first player to play:
- On the tee box
 - On the subsequent shots: and
 - On the putting green
- 12.5 The timing will start when a player has reached his ball, it is his turn to play and he is able to play without interference or distraction. On putting green, timing will start when the player has had a reasonable amount of time to lift, clean and replaced his ball, repair ball marks and move loose impediments on his line of putt. Time spent looking at the line from beyond the hole and/ or behind the ball will count as time taken for the next stroke.
- 12.6 Timing ceases when a group is either back in position in relation to the preceding group or within the allocated time for the holes played.

- 12.7 If a group is "out of position" more than once during a round, the above procedure will apply on each occasion. Bad times and the applications of penalties in the same round will be carried forward until the Round is completed. A player will not be penalized if he has a second bad time before being advised of his earlier bad time.

13. USE OF MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION & CADDIE

13.1 All players will be provided with a buggy on TWIN SHARING basis during the stipulated round.

13.2 The use of caddy is **NOT Allowed** during the tournament rounds except on the Official practice round.

Penalty of breach of 13.2 shall be

The player gets the General Penalty for each hole during which he or she is helped by a CADDIE.

If the breach happens or continues between two holes, the player gets the General Penalty for the next hole.

14. APPROVED EQUIPMENT

14.1 Golf Balls (Rule 4.2a)

Balls Allowed in Play of Round

(1) Conforming Ball Must Be Played. In making each stroke, a player must use a ball that conforms to the requirements in the Equipment Rules.

A player may get a conforming ball to play from anyone else, including another player on the course.

(2) Deliberately Altered Ball Must Not Be Played. A player must not make a stroke at a ball whose performance characteristics have been deliberately altered, such as by scuffing or heating the ball or by applying any substance (other than in cleaning it).

14.2 Equipment (Rule 4.3a)

Allowed and Prohibited

Uses

A player may use equipment to help his or her play during a round, except that a player must not create a potential advantage by:

- 1) Using equipment (other than a club or a ball) that artificially eliminates or reduces the need for a skill or judgment that is essential to the challenge of the game, or
- 2) Using equipment (including a club or a ball) in an abnormal way in making a stroke. "Abnormal way" means a way that is fundamentally different than its intended use and is not normally recognized as part of playing the game.

This Rule does not affect the application of any other Rule that limits actions a player is allowed to take with a club, ball or other equipment (such as setting down a club or other object to help the player in lining up, see Rule 10.2b(3)).

PENALTY: DISQUALIFICATION

16. SCORE CARDS

- 16.1 All competitors must submit their respective scorecard duly signed and counter signed by his/her marker as soon as possible after the completion of each round and in any event, it shall not be later than **10 minutes** after the completion of each round.
- 16.2 A scorecard is deemed to be submitted the moment the competitor leaves the scoring area.

17. PRIZES

Gross Champion

- 17.1 The competitor who returns the lowest aggregate gross scores over 54 holes or less shall be declared “The Champion” and will be awarded with the Championship Trophy.
- 17.2 Prizes will be awarded as follows:

Gross Event

For Men

1st to 10th placing gross scores over 54 holes or less

For Ladies

1st to 3rd placing only gross scores over 54 holes or less

Intermediate A

- 17.3 The competitor who returns the lowest aggregate net scores over 54 holes or less shall be declare “The Intermediate A Champion”.
- 17.4 Prize will be awarded as follows:
- 1st to 10th placing net scores over 54 holes or less

Intermediate B

- 17.5 The competitor who returns the lowest aggregate net scores over 54 holes or less shall be declare “The Intermediate B Champion”.
- 17.6 Prize will be awarded as follows:
- 1st to 10th placing net scores over 54 holes or less

NOTE: Number of prizes may be changed depending on the final entries.

18. COMPETITION CLOSED

- 18.1 The Championship shall be deemed to have closed when the prizes have been awarded to the winners.

19. TIES

- 19.1 In the event of a tie for Gross category for the first place, the winner shall be decided by a sudden death playoff on the hole to be decided by the Committee until the winner is decided by elimination. The purpose of the play-off is to decide the **WINNER** for the championship only.

- 19.2 In the event of a tie for any other places Gross and Intermediate, the tie shall be decided by a count-back on the score card in the following order:

Last 18 holes.

Last 9 holes.

Last 6 holes.

Last 3 holes and finally last hole.

If the tie is still undecided, it shall be decided by lot.

20. DECISIONS

- 20.1 If a referee has been appointed by the Tournament Committee, his/her decision shall be final. (Rule 20.2).
- 20.2 In the absence of a referee, any dispute or doubtful point on the Rules must be forwarded to The Tournament Committee, whose decisions shall be final (Rule 20.2b).

21. DISPUTES AND APPEAL

- 21.1 Any disputes that arise during the tournament must be put forward to the Appeal Committee as soon as practicable upon completion of a round and in any event, it shall not be later than **15 minutes** after completion of the said round.
- 21.2 A penalty of disqualification may in exceptional cases be waived, modified or imposed by the Tournament Appeal Committee.

22. ETIQUETTE

- 22.1 All players should practice good etiquette as detailed out in Section 1 of the Rules of Golf. The overriding principle is that consideration should be shown to others on the course at all times.

Serious Breach of Etiquette

The following may be considered “serious breach of etiquette” for this competition:

- (a) Usage of hand phone during a round to the annoyance and distractions of other players.
- (b) Verbal abuse of fellow competitor/official/staff.
- (c) Intentionally distracting or offending fellow competitors.
- (d) Consuming alcoholic drinks during play.

PENALTY: DISQUALIFICATION

Note: Any other 'breaches of etiquette' not listed above will be dealt with by the Committee on individual basis.
Exception: Players may use hand phone in case of buggy breakdown or injury/illness of players.

23. DRUGS

23.1 Players must not make use of any drug to enhance performance. Should player show evidence of use of a drug for non-therapeutic purposes, The Tournament Committee may require the player to undergo a drug test. Any player infringing this condition may be disqualified. Players who are on medication and in doubt as to their clinical status should seek advice from The R&A via the Tournament Office.

24. INCLEMENT WEATHER AND SUSPENSION OF PLAY

24.1 The Tournament Committee will make every effort to complete the event in its entirety. However, The Tournament Committee reserves the right to suspend or abandon play as and when necessary if weather-related circumstances require such action. The Tournament Committee will inform all competitors accordingly.

25. INDEMNITY/ LIABILITIES

MGA, the Sponsors, The Tournament Committee, the Club and their staff will not be responsible for any loss, damage or harm, or any form of injuries that the participants may suffer as a result of their participation in this tournament.
